Women's group opposes female Court nominee *Nine Justice Scalias would be better*

Herndon, VA—President Obama's Supreme Court nominee, US Solicitor General **Elena Kagan**, is the wrong choice to sit on our nation's highest court, says the **Clare Boothe Luce Policy Institute**, a leading women's advocacy group.

Institute President **Michelle Easton** says, "Kagan's radical views and defense of socialism are not representative of the values that most American women hold. Couple that with her utter lack of judicial experience and no paper trail of thoughtful legal opinions, and it's clear that Kagan does not merit a seat on the highest court of the land."

Female version of Obama is no comfort to women.

Easton says that excitement that Kagan's appointment would mean three women on the Court for the first time in history is meaningless if those women are liberal activist Justices.

In her college [thesis](#) at Princeton, Kagan laments the decline of socialism in America, stating that she is "sad" and that, "In our own times, a coherent socialist movement is nowhere to be found in the United States."

"Preserving America's fundamental freedoms by interpreting the Constitution according to its original understanding is better not only for women, but for all Americans," says Easton. "In reality, nine Justice Scalias would be more representative of women than these three radical leftist women. Kagan is just a female carbon copy of Obama, whose extreme liberalism has pushed this country into an unprecedented downward spiral."

Lack of experience does not merit consideration for seat on the Court.

Easton also points out that President Obama's lack of experience allowed him to falsely persuade the American people that he was a moderate, and he and the Left are attempting the same approach with Kagan.

"Obama was able to convince many Americans that he was a moderate because of a lack of any substantial public policy experience. He is trying to sell Americans the same fiction with his Kagan nomination," claims Easton. "But you don't have to look all the way back to Kagan's college thesis to see just how radical her views are. Her discrimination against patriotic students and military recruiters during her time at Harvard and her recent attempt to censor First Amendment free speech rights in the *Citizens United* case both speak volumes."
